5.0 Conclusion

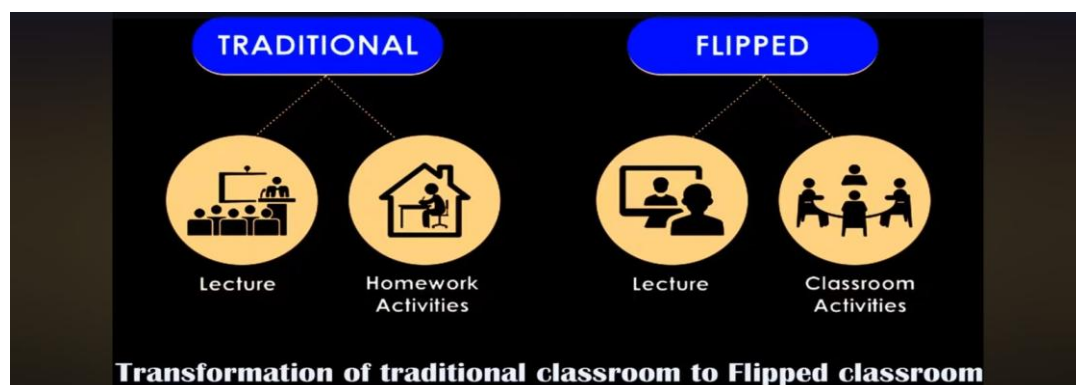
